PEF

We have teamed up with AFC CT to employ a Community Trust Coach one day per week. He is going to be working on Promoting Positive Playtimes. He is doing something called Red Start with some classes at present to get to know learners and then he will be doing more targeted work with pupils relating to resilience and confidence.

PA System
